1		Mayor Doyle brought the meeting to order at 6:30pm.
2		Motion #273 Rick Raymond/Beatrice Burry Proposed to move #10 on the agenda to the beginning of the meeting. All in favor, motion carried.
3		Lynn Best was present in chambers to discuss the dead end at her property. She noted that the sign that is there now is small and is not visible. She stated she has had damage to her pavement from cars trying to turn around in the area.  Motion #274 Ed Dyke/Irene Stack Proposed to purchase larger "No Exit, Dead End, No Turnaround" sign for the area. All in favor, motion carried.
		Ms. Best also noted that she would like to see some flowerpots on Southside Road. Staff will speak to Jackie Connolly to see if the town can have a few pots on Southside Road.

9		#27 Splash Pad Project – The CAO was speaking to ACOA with regard to this project. The town has gone out to tender on two occasions. Bids for the first tender came in well over budget. The town then reduced the scope of the project and retendered. The town did not receive any bids on this tender. ACOA has given the town an extension to the project of December 31, 2023. This deadline cannot be extended. This is a very tight deadline and may not be possible to make this project come to fruition. The town will have a meeting with ACOA and the engineer to discuss what can happen with this project moving forward. If the splash pad is not possible the town may be able to use these funds for another project, but it would have to meet the criteria for the funding.
