Ms. Hayes also presented a diagram of the properties and the water lines in the area. She noted that from what she is being told, the leak to the line is by the retaining
		wall in the area. She noted that she is very concerned over this water break causing water build up in Stack's Lane which may in turn be dangerous to the residents at 10 Stack's Lane. Mr. Hayes then spoke to council and gave a history of the properties in the area. He noted that he and the owner of 10 Cribbies Road sold some property
		to the owner of 10B Cribbies Road. Mr. Hayes stated that there is a retaining wall that the property owner of 10B erected in the area that is now over his water line. Mr. Hayes asked council if they could give him permission to take down the fence in the area to fix the break. The CAO noted that the town did get legal advice on this matter. Councillor Dyke noted that he had some questions on the legal advice and would like to meet privately to discuss. Council decided that they would meet privately after the public meeting to discuss.
