Mr. Doyle also noted that there is an area between his property and the neighbouring property were water runs. Mayor Lee stated that this would also have to be addressed when looking at placing culverts in the area. There was some discussion with regard to running the drain across the street as it has always been. It was noted that there is an issue with this culvert as it runs onto private property.
