5		#6 The property at 36B Long Run Road has been cleaned up. A letter was sent to the property owner asking if the foundation on the property would be removed. The property owner stated that he has no plans on removing the foundation. Staff will send a letter to the adjoining property owner to see if he will be starting the repairs to that property now that 36B has been torn down and cleaned up.
